

Summary of Clark County

Demographic Information

- The majority of respondents from Clark County were in the age range of 25-64 (70%). Females accounted for 75% of the respondents, while males accounted for 25%.
- The ethnicity of respondents from Clark County is predominantly white, with 98% indicating as such. Of the respondents, 7% reported belonging to the Amish community.
- There were nearly identical percentages for each category of responses on types of health coverage.
- The majority of survey respondents had an education level of a high school diploma or higher with 40% reporting a high school diploma and 33% reporting having college or higher.
- The highest percentage of respondents' (33%) annual household income level was between \$25,001 and \$40,000 a year. In addition, 27% of the population reported making between \$10,000 and \$25,000 a year.

Health Concerns

Lifestyle Health Risks

- The top three health concerns indicated to be **important** by survey respondents were: child safety seat use with 87%, illegal drug use with 87%, and underage drinking with 85%.
- The top lifestyle health risk indicated to be **not important** by the highest number of survey respondents was lead in homes with 16%.
- The two highest lifestyle health risks recognized as **being adequately met** are: adequate immunizations and child safety seat use, both with percentages of 71.
- The highest lifestyle health risks recorded as **not being adequately met** are: underage drinking with 69%, illegal drug use with 67%, and tobacco use with 58%.

Diseases

- The top four diseases indicated to be **important** by survey respondents were: cancer with 85%, Alzheimer's disease with 74%, mental disorders with 73%, and heart disease with 72%.
- The top disease indicated to be **not important** was depression with 11%.

- The three diseases with the highest number of respondents indicating that the problem was **not adequately being met** were: depression with 56%, cancer with 46%, and mental disorders with 44%.
- Influenza with 48% and pneumonia with 47% were the two diseases with the highest number of respondents reporting as **being adequately met**.

Environmental Health

- The top three environmental health concerns listed as **important** by the highest percentage of respondents were: drinking water quality with 83%, trash disposal with 67%, and community safety with 67%.
- The top two environmental health concerns listed as **not important** were: domestic animal control with 24% and bioterrorism with 19%.
- Trash disposal (53%), recycling (46%), and drinking water quality (45%) were listed as **being adequately met** by the highest percentage of respondents.
- The top two health concerns listed as **not being adequately met** were: domestic animal control with 51% and crime prevention with 44%.

Affordable Health Care

- The majority of respondents (60%) believe that prescription drugs and health insurance are not affordable.
- Of those responding, 21% believe that preventative screenings are affordable.
- 34% listed that they did not know if mental health care is affordable.

Local Health Care

- The majority of respondents (60%) believe the county health department to be excellent, 24% replied that the local hospital is poor.
- All of the respondents (100%) reported that they had not used telehealth services in the last year.

V. Other Needs

- Of those that responded, 41% replied excellent for flu shots **being met** and 51 % replied excellent on immunizations for children.
- Needs that respondents marked **being met** as poor were: chronic disease support groups with 63%, support groups with 54%, prostate cancer with 51%, as well as both consumer insurance education and fitness/wellness with 50%.

- Community health education (70%), school health services (68%), blood pressure screenings (68%), and immunizations for children (68%) were the top four services indicated as **needed** in the county.
