Learn everything you need to know to implement ICD-10. The American Academy of Professional Coders (AAPC) boot camps cover all aspects of the ICD-10 transition process, including a general overview structure and guidelines, cross-walking and mapping, organizing the implementation effort, and hands-on exercises. This live group training is designed for those with responsibility over their practice or facility's coding, health information management and/or implementation of ICD-10, including office managers, practice managers, administrators, coding/billing managers and coding/billing educators.

Each attendee will receive the AAPC's complete ICD-10 Implementation Manual, CD Rom with templates and tools, and the ICD-10 Code Book in its latest draft. Up to 16 CEUs will be offered—8 core and 8 basic.

Note: It is anticipated that a hard set code training will be offered in May or June of 2012 when available.
