

Summary of Macon County

Demographic Information

- The most common age of the respondents to the survey reported being in the 25-44 age group with 47.2%, followed by the age group of 45-64 with 34.7%. Most of the respondents to the survey were female with 74%, while 26% were male.
- Just over half (51.3%) of household members were covered under group insurance, followed by 13.1% covered by Medicare with supplemental insurance.
- There were four ethnic categories represented by respondents. They were as follows: White with 95.6%, Black with 2.2%, American Indian/Alaskan Native with 1.5%, and Asian with .74%. Of the respondents, 1.5% replied that they belonged to the cultural community of Mennonite, while 3.7% responded with other for their cultural community.
- Of those who returned the survey, 42.1% reported having a high school diploma, 33.8% reported a college degree or higher, and 20.3% reported having some college.
- The majority of the respondents (26.4%) indicated an annual household income level of \$10,000-\$25,000, while 20.9% fell between earnings of \$25,001-\$40,000 a year. Earned incomes of \$40,001-\$55,000 were reported by 19.4%, and 14% reported annual income of \$55,001-\$70,000. Household incomes of over \$70,000 were reported by 12.4%, while incomes of less than \$10,000 were reported by 7% of the respondents.

Health Concerns

Lifestyle Health Risks

- The top three lifestyle health risks indicated to be **important** by survey respondents were: illegal drug use with 92.1%, child safety seat use with 89.7%, and child abuse/neglect with 89.6%.
- The top two lifestyle health risks indicated as **not important** were: lead in homes with 12.4%, and condom use with 6.5%.
- The three lifestyle health risks recognized as **being adequately met** were: immunizations with 77%, seat belt use with 64.8%, and child safety seat use with 64.2%.
- The four highest lifestyle health risks recognized as **not adequately being met** were: obesity at 59.8%, illegal drug use at 58.4%, underage drinking at 52.4%, and teenage pregnancy at 52.4%.

Diseases

- The top three diseases indicated to be **important** by respondents were: cancer with 89.1%, heart disease with 84.4%, and 77.8% of the population thought that some other disease was a concern.
- There were no diseases that were recognized as being **not important** to the residents of Macon County.
- The three diseases recognized as **being adequately met** were: high cholesterol with 42.7%, vision loss with 42.7%, and pneumonia with 42.4%.
- The three diseases with the highest number of respondents indicating that the problem was **not adequately being met** were: asthma at 29.6%, dental problems at 28.8%, and depression at 25.2%.

Environmental

- The top three environmental health concerns listed as **important** by respondents were: drinking water quality at 91%, crime prevention at 81.3%, and restaurant inspection at 80.6%.
- The top three environmental concerns listed as **not important** were: lead poisoning inspection with 11.7%, onsite sewage inspection with 11%, and domestic animal control with 10.8%.
- The top three concerns listed as **adequately being met** were: trash disposal with 70.2%, drinking water quality with 64.9%, and community safety with 50.8%.
- Crime prevention at 35.6% and recycling at 43.1% were the top two environmental health concerns listed as **not adequately being met**.

Affordable Health Care

- In the not affordable category, 58.8% responded with dental care, 47.7% indicated prescription drugs, and 45.4% marked emergency care.
- Medical care (46.4%) and vision (48.8%) were believed to be somewhat affordable.
- Of the respondents, 34.6% did not know if mental health care was affordable.

Local Health Care

- The highest percentage of respondents listed private physicians (46.3%) and the county health department (37.5%) as excellent.
- Of the respondents, 10.8% feel the local hospital services are poor.

- Telehealth was indicated as a very unused service with 95.8% reporting that they had not used it within the last year, in addition 78.9% reported that they did not know how to rate the services.

Other Needs

- The top three services indicated as being excellently met were: immunizations for children with 44.0%, WIC with 40.2%, and issuing of birth and death certificates at 37.6%.
- The top three services indicated to be poorly met were: consumer insurance education programs with 52.2%, chronic disease support groups at 47.6%, and skin cancer screenings at 39.0%.
- Flu shots with 80.4%, blood pressure screenings with 76.8%, and mammograms with 75.4% were indicated as being **needed** in the county.
- Flu shots at 11.6%, and immunizations for children at 11.7% were the most common responses to services the county does **not need**.
